

ORDINANCE NO. 1-90

An ordinance to prohibit the placing of signs or advertising matters on public property and electric power poles:

WHEREAS the placing of signs and advertising matters on public property and electric power poles has become a nuisance in the Town of Elizabeth in that the persons placing this advertisement seldom ever returns and removes the signs; and

WHEREAS there is no way to insure that signs or advertisements once placed on the public property or electric power poles can be made to be removed or to punish the persons for not removing the material.

NOW BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen in regular session convened that upon the effective date of this ordinance that it shall be unlawful for anyone to place signs or advertising matters on public property and electric power poles within the Town of Elizabeth.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen that violation of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100.00 or imprisonment for not more than thirty (30) days, or both.

The above ordinance was offered by Alderman Terry Rasberry and seconded by Alderman Lawrence Crawford and unanimously adopted Section by Section and then as a whole on this 6th day of March, 1990.
