

A ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE KEEPING OF LIVESTOCK AND FOWL WITHIN A CERTAIN PART OF THE TOWN OF ELIZABETH

WHEREAS the keeping of livestock and fowl within the city limits of the Town of Elizabeth constitutes a health hazard to the citizens of the Town of Elizabeth with the exception of lots measuring an acre or more, because of the crowded living conditions, and

WHEREAS, the word "livestock" as used in this article shall include cattle, horses, mules, donkeys, sheep, goats, hogs and all other domestic animals except dogs and cats, and

WHEREAS, the word "fowl" as used in this article shall include chickens, ducks, geese, turkeys and guinea, but is to exclude domestic birds.

BE IT ORDAINED that the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Elizabeth in regular session convened do ordain that after the effective date of this ordinance that it shall be unlawful for anyone to possess or keep livestock or fowl, as defined in this ordinance, however this ordinance shall not apply where the lot upon which the home is situated is one acre or more.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Elizabeth that violations of this ordinance shall be punished with a fine not to exceed One Hundred and no/100 (\$100.00) Dollars or imprisonment for not more than thirty (30) days or both.

The above ordinance was offered by Margaret Osborn, and seconded by Constance Thompson, and adopted on this 1st day of November, 1988.
